WELCOME TO CONFERENCE 2012

Welcome to the Centennial Conference of the Methodist Church of New Zealand, Te Hahi Weteriana o Aotearoa.

As this is the 100th Conference of our church we have chosen as our theme...

God of the past, present and future

During our time together we will be looking at our beginnings with the Declaration of Union between the Wesleyan and the Primitive Methodists in 1913. We will work through developments in our Church and its response to the people and Nation of Aotearoa and beyond. As we look to the future we will explore whether we are being true to the legacy that we as Methodists inherited from our Forebears.

Conference 2012 will be held at various locations across Wellington. Induction and Ordination Services will be held at the Anglican Cathedral of St. Paul, cnr. Molesworth and Hill Streets, Thorndon. Business events will be held at Wesley Church, 75 Taranaki Street, Te Aro. The Powhiri/Welcome and Centennial Dinner will be held at Pipitea Marae, 55-59 Thorndon Quay, Thorndon. Other events will be held at the Mercy Conference Centre, 15 Guilford Terrace, Thorndon.

Conference will begin with the Powhiri on Saturday 3 November, followed by lunch and the Induction Service for President and Vice-President.

During lunch families of the deceased will gather for a time of remembering their loved ones who have served the Connexion and who have died since the previous conference.

Later in the afternoon there will be a service for the Celebration of Life and Leadership of those presbyters and lay people who retire at this conference and acknowledgement of those concluding Connexional Appointments.

In the evening the Centennial Dinner will be held with the Governor General being the guest speaker and the Patea Maori Choir the entertainers.

We meet at 8.30 on Sunday morning in the Civic Square behind the Wellington Town Hall. We will be led by the Tongan Band as we walk from there to Wesley Wellington Church just as our forebears did 100 years ago. During our service there, students from Wesley College will present a production to assist us in our Connexional Vision – ‘Let the Children Live’ as we begin to look at the way forward for the future.

On Sunday afternoon the Ordination Service will begin at 1pm. We hope as many as possible from the Greater Wellington parishes will join us.

Business sessions take place from Monday to Wednesday. On Monday during the Council of Conference session at 2.30pm the Commissioner to Children, Dr Russell Wills, will address the Conference to support ‘Let the Children Live’ initiative.

Each day will begin with worship further extending our theme. On Monday Wesley Historical Society will centre our thoughts on the past. On Tuesday Te Taha Maori will concentrate on the present and on Wednesday the Youth will lead us into the Future.

May this Conference be a significant and challenging event as we cherish the past, embrace the present and welcome the future as the Methodist family - Te Haahi Weteriana O Aotearoa moves into its next century with passion and compassion as we think about the life of the church in our community.

WHERE WE GATHER

Historial Background: Early Wesleyan Maori Mission in Te Upoko o Te Ika

Te Aro

Te Aro Park at the corner of Dixon/Manners Streets was the original site of the Wesleyan Maori Mission to Te Aro Pa. In June 1839 John Hobbs and John Bumby of the Wesleyan Mission arrived in Wellington Harbour with a party of Taranaki Maori.

Hutt Valley

In June 1839 Bumby and Hobbs spent a night at Waiwhetu Pa, and also

visited Pito-one Pa. They appointed Wesleyan Native Teachers at the various Pa around the harbour.

In 1850 Awamutu appeared on the Maori preaching plan. In November a new Maori Chapel was opened at Pito-one. In 1855 there were six centres of Maori activity, with about 300 Wesleyan adherents.

In 1872 Hetaraka Warihi was preaching regularly at Taita, Awhekaihe, Waiwhetu, Pito-one and Awamutu. However, the pa of the Hutt were now in decline due to deaths and migration back to Taranaki. By 1885 when Warihi left the area the few Maori left in the Hutt lacked settlements, leadership and an economic base.

Porirua and the Kapiti Coast

Bumby and Hobbs also visited Mana Island in June 1839. There they met Te Rauparaha, holding a service of worship in his house. A Native Teacher, Paora was left with Te Rauparaha and his people.

Aldred travelled to Porirua and along the Kapiti Coast to hold services at various pa. Services were held at Te Paripari Te Uruhi, Waikanae, Taupo, Whareroa and Wainui Pa. Takapuwahia was another regular preaching place.

The Wairarapa

In March 1842 John Aldred spent two days visiting Maori in the Wairarapa.

Ironside visited the Wairarapa on several occasions in the 1840s. On each occasion he baptised Maori. However difficulty of access, and stretched resources, meant there was infrequent contact with the area.

In 1872 Hetaraka Warahi endeavoured to pick up the Wesleyan cause. Places he visited included, Turanganui, Kohunui, and Pukiokio. In 1888 William Rowse who had retired to Greytown began visiting Maori of the Wairarapa. In 1893 he reported that no regular Wesleyan work had been carried on since the removal of Hetaraka Warahi from the District in 1885.

The Conference Church – Wesley Taranaki Street

One hundred years ago, in February 1913, the Methodist Church of New Zealand held its first annual conference at Wesley Church, Taranaki Street, marking the union in New Zealand of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and the Primitive Methodist Church.

Methodism in the Wellington District goes back to June 1839 when Minarapa Rangihatuake invited the Revs John Bumby and John Hobbs to conduct the first Christian service on the future site of Wellington. Before the end of June 1839 Maori Christians had built a raupo church near Te Aro Pa, the first Christian church in the Port Nicholson area. The chapel at Te Aro was soon too small for the growing congregation and the first European Church was opened in August 1843. Three more churches were built on the site in Manners Street near the Cuba Street corner, the last of these being destroyed by fire in June 1879.

The fire led the Trustees to decide to purchase an acre in Taranaki Street in the thickly populated part of the town. In March 1880 the present Wesley Church was opened, designed by Thomas Tumbull. Part of the Manners Street site was retained, and the rents from Te Aro Court continue to be an important source of revenue for present-day Wesley Wellington. Other buildings on the Taranaki Street site followed later.

In the late 1940s a commission on the future of the central church recommended that the congregation stay in Taranaki Street and undertake a comprehensive social services ministry. The Social Services Trust was formed in 1949 and began the development of an eventide settlement at Naenae in the Hutt Valley. Today Wesley Community Action is the social services arm of Wellington Methodist Parish.

In 1969 Wesley Church committed itself with other central city churches to a shared ecumenical ministry to the city through the Inner City Ministry, later renamed the the Downtown Community Ministry. Another significant development has been the growth of the Pacific Island congregations within the life of Wesley Church. Samoan, Tongan, Fijian and English Language Congregations each have their own ministry, worship and congregational structures. All share in the parish administration and join together in a multicultural communion service on the first Sunday of the month.

The interior of the church was extensively remodelled in 1962/63 to the plans of noted Austrian architect Ernst Plischke, and further restoration was carried out after fire badly damaged the front of the church in January 1982. In 1995 the Wesley Centre was opened next to the church, providing for the growing needs of the four congregations and housing the Parish Office, ministers' offices, counselling rooms and a new hall as well as a leased café. Early this year Wesley Community Action returned to the Taranaki Street property and now occupy space in the renovated Epworth Building at the rear of the old Wesley hall.

POWHIRI: WELCOME TO CONFERENCE

The Powhiri (Welcome) to Conference will be held Pipitea Marae, 55-59 Thorndon Quay, Thorndon, commencing at 10:15am on Saturday 3 November 2012.

The powhiri is a formal process of recognising and acknowledging the coming together of two peoples, those of the place of gathering and those from elsewhere. The powhiri is a process that allows us to acknowledge and mourn our dead together, to honour each other to celebrate and share in a communal and family way. We have adapted this process to reflect the bicultural nature of our church and our deeply rooted sense of social justice as we begin our Methodist Conference each year. It belongs to all of us.

Our hosts this year are the iwi of Taranaki Whānau Whānui, the tribes of this region.

Members of conference, manuhiri (guests), will wait at the driveway entrance to Pipitea Marae where the karanga (welcoming call) will be the signal to advance onto the marae.

Te Taha Māori, the Presidential team and families of the deceased will lead members of conference onto the marae.

After the karanga the men will lead members of conference to be greeted by our hosts, shake hands or hongī (touch noses) and enter into the wharenuī (meeting house) called Te Ika nui a Māui.

The speakers for the manuhiri will take the front row of seats, the families of the deceased will take up the next few rows and all other conference members will enter and take up seats throughout the hall.

Speeches of greetings and acknowledgements will then commence.

At 12.15pm, Families of the deceased leave by bus for Mercy Conference Centre.

Lunch will be provided at Pipitea Marae, 12:30pm.

The Induction Service for the incoming President and Vice-President will begin at 2:00pm at the Anglican Cathedral of St. Paul, cnr. Molesworth and Hill Streets, Thorndon

Please be seated by 1:50pm. The President and Vice President's sponsors and all those who will be processing are to meet in the rooms to the right of the Sanctuary no later than 1:45pm.

Please note: No photography is allowed during the Powhiri or other Conference services except by the official photographer. Mobile phones should be switched off.

ROLES OF PEOPLE & GROUPS OF CONFERENCE

President

Rev Rex Nathan fills an important pastoral role in the life of Conference and beyond. He shares leadership with the Vice-President and brings a sacramental ministry to the Conference.

Vice-President

Miss Jan Tasker shares with the President in the leadership role of

Conference, and brings a pastoral concern, as well as sharing in the leadership team.

Tumuaki

Rev Diana Tana fills this position and provides leadership for Te Taha Maori.

Executive Officer, Tauivi

The Rev Nigel Hanscamp provides leadership for Tauivi.

General Secretary

The General Secretary, Rev David Bush, acts as the Secretary of Conference and has responsibility for the ordering of the Theology at Work (Business) Sessions of Conference. He is responsible for seeing that the reports are collated and that the business of Conference is dealt with.

Council of Elders

Present at Conference will be members of the Council of Elders. The Council consists of four people, two representing Te Taha Maori and two representing the Tauivi part of the Church (i.e. Pakeha, Pacific Island, African, Asian etc).

Their responsibilities include observing the way things are said and decided at Conference, against the background of the Church's bi-cultural journey. They may take opportunities to comment on what they see happening, and may intervene if they believe something taking place is contrary to the Church's bi-cultural commitment.

When a member of the Council speaks in Conference it is on behalf of the whole Council and after consultation with **all** Elders. The Council seeks to model an equal partnership, with half the Elders representing Te Taha Maori and half Tauivi (the rest of the Church), and makes its decisions through consensus.

Legal Advisor

Howard Lawry is appointed by the Conference and attends the Conference to ensure that the finer details of Church Law are adhered to. Presently the Legal Adviser checks all decisions that come to Conference, so as to ensure that the decision can be understood at a later date.

Te Taha Maori & Tauivi

Are the partners who make up the life of Conference. Te Taha Maori are Tangata Whenua (the people who are of the land). Tauivi is the name used within The Methodist Church of New Zealand/Te Hahi Weteriana o Aotearoa to describe the people who have come later to settle here from Europe, Asia, the Pacific, Africa, and other places.

Council of Conference

Conference has appointed a Council of Conference made up of 20 members. Ten members are nominated by Te Taha Maori and ten members nominated by Tauivi. The President, Vice-President and General Secretary are members and act as resource people. The work of the Council is focused on vision, policy and monitoring processes for the Church, rather than decision-making.

Vahefonua Tonga 'o Aotearoa

Vahefonua is the Tongan Synod of the Methodist Church which meets during the year to make decisions relating to the life and work of Tongan Congregations.

Sinoti Samoa

The Samoan Synod meets through the year and makes decisions relating to the Samoan section of the Church. It reports to Conference.

Boards & Standing Committees

The Conference has a number of Standing Committees that meet throughout the year. Each carries out tasks asked of them by Conference and reports to the Conference. The Committees relate to matters such as Ministry, Faith and Order, Mission and Ecumenical and Social Issues.

Youth Delegation

The Conference has determined that there will be a youth delegation of 10 present at Conference. In addition, individual parishes may choose to nominate a youth person to represent them. The Youth Delegation tends to sit together in order to caucus as youth and sometimes comment to Conference as youth.

Media Liaison Officer

Alan Webster is the Media Liaison Officer for Conference. Alan will be preparing a Summary Report of Conference to assist in reporting back to Parishes.

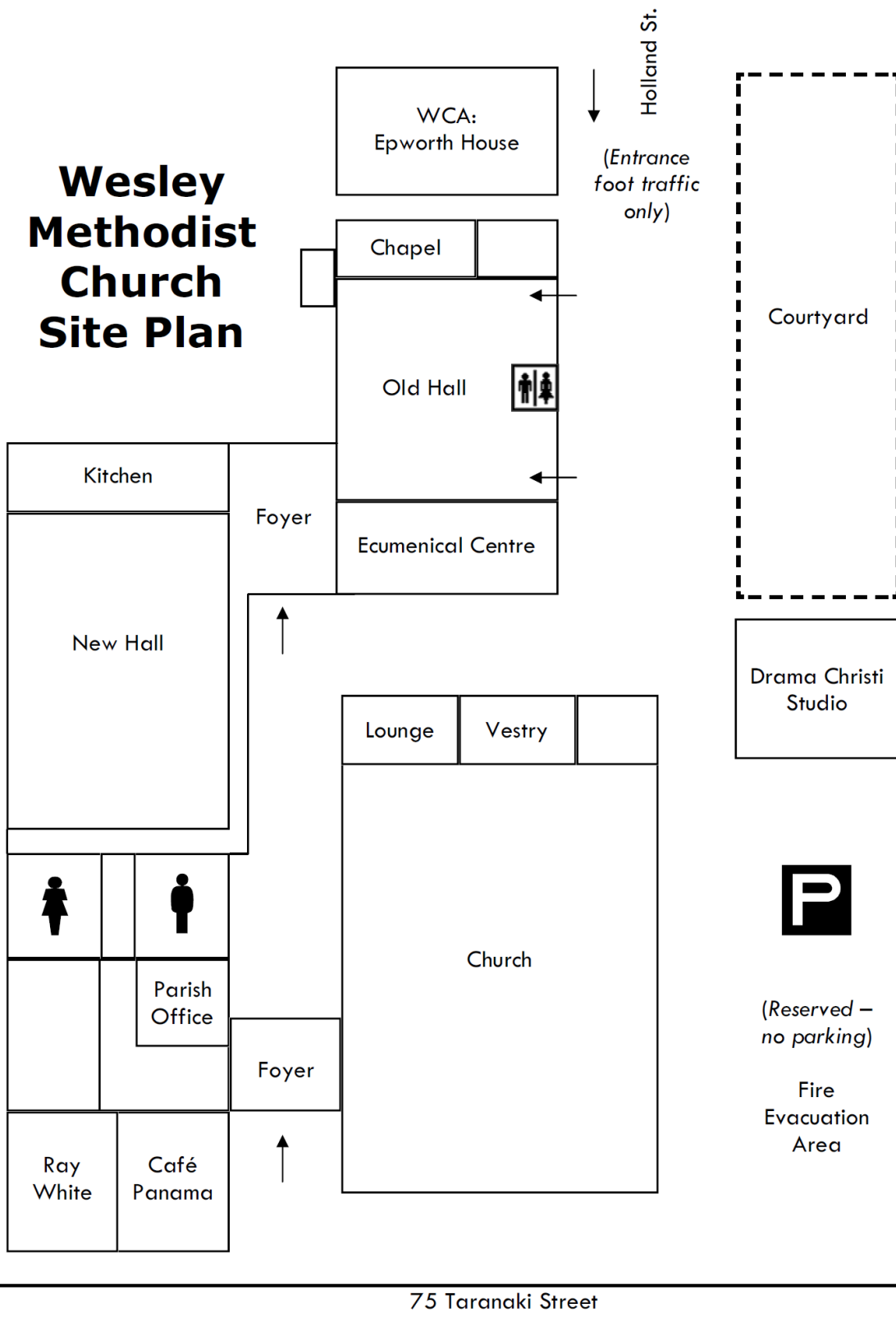
