### **Sources of biographical information about lay preachers held in the Methodist Church of New Zealand Archives**

Lay preachers were previously called “local preachers” until 1962. A lay preacher was a person approved at the parish Quarterly Meeting to take services. They usually sat exams to be a lay preacher, and acted in this role on a part-time basis.

The New Zealand Methodist Lay Preachers’ Association National Executive records are held in the Methodist Church of New Zealand Archives. Branch records are included with parish archives.

The Methodist Archives does not hold a full list of people who were lay preachers as this activity was not well documented in the nineteenth century.

Today the Methodist Lay Preachers’ Association has joined with other similar denominations.
