The Rev. Wilfred Kurepitu wrote to the director of M&E saying, (on 24 February 2015)

"A Lent greeting to you my friend from Kokegolo. I hope this email finds vou well. Now regards a doctor as you mentioned in our previous emails, I think it is a good idea to first identify one surgical doctor or general practioner; the next step is to seek funding because we are without doctor for a long time now. If possible you and I can consult the UK Methodist and the Uniting World Australia to help in funding. I discussed with HGH staffs about this idea and they are in support and wanted a doctor for three years not on short term. I will wait for your response if possible this week. Thanks for your cooperation.

The Moderator wrote on 16 February 2015 saying, "I was going around inducting ministers and Principals in the year's beginning. But may I salute you for the news and the commitments to the church in the Solomon's. Regards replacement of doctors for Helena Goldie Hospital, yes we have consulted the Ministry of Health of the Government of Solomon Islands and was promised to give one and still waiting. We are without a doctor for three months. The government still leave the church for the medical superintendent position as they shall provide medical officer only. It is here friends and partners I need you all to consider giving us one though there's policy. Thanks. Moderator Wilfred Kurepitu – Sent from my iPhone

We seek your prayers and continued support for the United Church Solomon Islands. The search for a doctor and funding to support the salary and other assistance is becoming a more difficult task. I hope and pray that someone who reads this will be moved to care for the health of 27,000 people living in and around Munda in the Western Roviana province of Solomon Islands. – *PrinceD*.


A NOTE FROM THE SOLAR POWER UNIT CONTRACTOR FOR SASAMUQA HOSPITAL

Rev. Caleb Kotali wrote on 25 February 2015 saying, "I hope the Refurbishment works of the General Ward will be completed by the end of March or early April 2015."

The periodic progress reports are encouraging.
