# FAMILIES NEED URGENT ASSISTANCE IN SYRIA AND TURKEY

Turkey and Syria were struck by a major earthquake in the early hours of February 6, 2023 local time. Thousands of buildings have collapsed. Snow has fallen. Many people have lost their lives and been injured in the devastating quakes. Rescuers and local people are working hard to free people buried in the rubble.

The initial 7.8 magnitude earthquake has been followed by severe aftershocks in the southeast of Turkey and northwest Syria.

People are urgently in need of food, shelter and medical assistance.

Life was already hard. Many people had escaped conflicts and were extremely vulnerable. More than 4 million people were dependent on relief aid before the quakes. About three-quarters of the people living in Syria's Idlib province had fled fighting in other parts of the country.

The people need protection from the bitterly cold winter and cholera. The prices of food and fuel are rising fast. They need practical assistance to survive. If you can, please donate today.

## CYCLONE GABRIELLE APPEAL-NEW ZEALAND DIASTER FUND

Information for New Zealand Red Cross people about our role in supporting current emergencies and how to stay up-to-date. In their information The New Zealand Red Cross advises the following.

## Cyclone Gabrielle

Heavy rain, flooding and damaging winds continue to impact many parts of northern and central Aotearoa New Zealand, and our thoughts are with members and volunteers impacted by Cyclone Gabrielle.

The government declared a National State of Emergency on 14 February to assist in the response. The declaration applies to the regions that have already declared a local State of

Emergency: Northland, Auckland, Tairāwhiti Gisborne, Bay of Plenty, Waikato, Hawke's Bay and Tararua District.

We hope you and your whānau are okay and staying safe. If your life is in immediate danger call 111.

Volunteer as a disaster welfare response volunteer

We follow the direction of lead agencies when responding to an emergency. We only deploy appropriately trained Red Cross people as disaster welfare support volunteers.

Apply to join your nearest disaster welfare support team.

As this involves training for the role, you won't be able to assist with the current emergency, but you can help us get ready for the next one.

## Other types of volunteering

Our Red Cross members in Auckland can offer their time by completing an online form. Providing your details is not a commitment or guarantee that you will be asked to volunteer. It just tells us:

that you're willing to volunteer your time, and the skills you have to offer.



## THE WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

The annual World Day of Prayer is a time to pray for peace and justice with people throughout the world in services led by women. This year is Friday, 3 March around the country. All are welcome. Women from Taiwan have prepared this year's service, drawing inspiration from Ephesians, "I have heard about your faith". The women share their stories and bear witness to their faith in God. Services are prepared by members of the local World of Prayer committees and the international committee. "The first Friday in March is a special time to connect with people throughout the world and to listen and \learn about women from another part of the world. Inviting women from Taiwan to speak or share their own stories could enrich this focus," says Pauline McKay, National President.



Taiwan is made up of more than 100 islands and is situated on the Ring of Fire. Its rich biodiversity is represented in the poster by the Mikado Pheasant, Black-faced Spoonbill and the Butterfly orchid, the pride of Taiwan.





Indigenous people have lived on its islands for more than 6,000 years. Colonisation from China has meant that approximately 2% of the 23.6 million populationare members of the 16 recognised indigenous peoples. As a consequence of its history, many governments do not recognise Taiwan as a country. The worship material includes stories from Taiwanese women, for example Pao-Chu who shares her commitment to protecting the environment as well as prayers they have written. There are activities for children, a special music and a Bible study on Ephesians 1:15-20.0fferings from the services will go to the Bible Society, Christian World Service and Interchurch Hospital Chaplaincy as well as costs. The Bible Society plans to assist 3,000 Indian widows with Bibles, counselling, health check-ups, vocational training and other support. CWS will support Developers Foundation to improve livelihoods, protect the environment and prepare for disasters in the Philippines and the Women's Centre working to improve the working and living conditions of factory workers and empower women.

The World Day of Prayer is a global movement of Christian women who come together in prayer and for action in more than 170 countries.
