# Sources of biographical information about Home Missionaries held in the Methodist Church of New Zealand Archives

The Methodist Church *Law Book* defines a Home Missionary as "a Local Preacher who is employed as a full time agent of the Methodist Church of New Zealand and is in receipt of remuneration for his services."

Home Missionaries were allowed to use the title "Reverend" without having been ordained. However they still had to pass exams to be a Home Missionary.

Home Missionaries were directed by the New Zealand Methodist Conference as to where they would be stationed. They were paid at a lesser rate than ministers.

The first Home Missionaries in New Zealand were appointed about 1875. The last died in 1995.

Home Missionaries' files are held in the Methodist Church Archives.
