## Sources of biographical information about Methodist ministers held in the Methodist Church of New Zealand Archives

Methodist Church ministers are given the title "Reverend" after ordination. They become a minister, by being ordained by the President of the New Zealand Methodist Conference.

Usually ministers have attended Theological College and have had 4 years' probation before being ordained. Today, ministers are also referred to as "Presbyters".

A minister's full responsibilities are described in the Methodist Church *Law Book*. A pdf version of this can be seen on our website <u>www.methodist.org.nz</u>

The Connexional Office in Christchurch has always maintained a record of ministers, where they were stationed, and their birth and death dates if known. This information is included in the Methodist Archives People information files which can be viewed in the Methodist Archives Reading Room.
