

Methodist cemeteries in New Zealand

A list compiled by the Methodist Church of New Zealand Archives

The origins of this list came from a query by Murray Lynn who wanted to know the names of Methodist cemeteries throughout New Zealand for inclusion on his website. Our first question was – how do you define a Methodist cemetery?

We have called a Methodist cemetery, one that was originally associated with a specific Methodist Church. The term “Methodist” is used to cover the names of the branches of what is now the Methodist Church: Wesleyan, Primitive Methodist, Bible Christian, and United Methodist Free Churches.

This excludes public cemeteries, which in the nineteenth century, were set out in denominational areas. Often there was what was called a Wesleyan or Dissenters or Non-conformist area, for those of religious denominations other than Anglican (Church of England) or Roman Catholic.

In this list, we have included the original name of the Methodist church that the cemetery was attached to.

Names of cemeteries have changed over the years, and are often known locally by colloquial names rather than their proper name. Confusion over names has also arisen when the New Zealand Society of Genealogists started transcribing inscriptions on headstones – the information was sometimes sent to the Society using the locally known name rather than the correct name.

Many records relating to burials in the cemeteries in this list have been lost. Where original records are known to survive, this is noted in the notes column, along with the current administrators or owners of the cemetery, if known.

The Methodist Church of New Zealand Archives preserves the records of Methodist parishes and churches within the Parish Archives Collection. Lists of these records are published on the Methodist Church website www.methodist.org.nz under the Archives section of the site. Any surviving burial records or plot plans, which survive in their original form are included in this list.

Copies of information or lists are included in our cemeteries file. Copies of information held in the file can be purchased. In many cases, the only information surviving is the headstone transcripts compiled by members of the New Zealand Genealogical Society and this is noted.

If a parish no longer administers a Methodist cemetery, in most cases the cemetery now belongs to the relevant local council. When councils took over responsibility for cemeteries, the burial records were handed over at that time. In some cases, this is why there are no records held in the Methodist Church of New Zealand Archives.
