

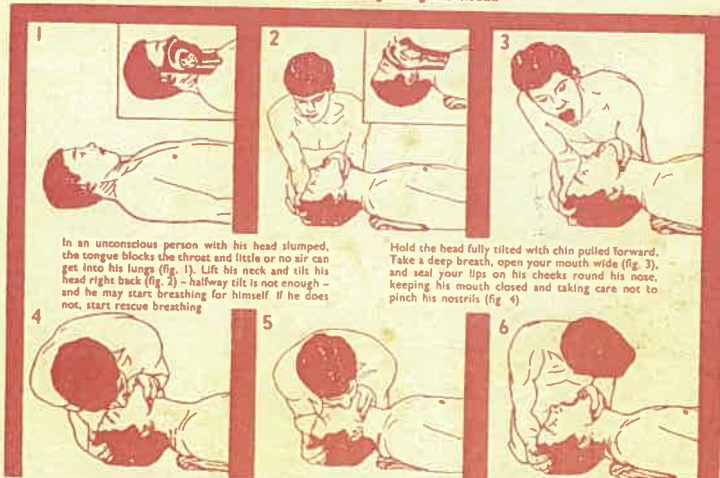

RESCUE BREATHING

Place the victim on his back and begin rescue breathing. Your first blowing efforts will show if his air passages are blocked and, if they are clear, will provide the urgently needed oxygen. If his throat is blocked, clear it quickly with your fingers. Slaps between the shoulder blades should dislodge a stubborn blockage.

Rescue breathing through the patient's nose is less likely to force air into his stomach. If his nose is blocked, however, try rescue breathing through his mouth.



In an unconscious person with his head slumped, the tongue blocks the throat and little or no air can get into his lungs (fig. 1). Lift his neck and tilt his head right back (fig. 2) - halfway tilt is not enough - and he may start breathing for himself. If he does not, start rescue breathing.

Hold the head fully tilted with chin pulled forward. Take a deep breath, open your mouth wide (fig. 3), and seal your lips on his cheeks round his nose, keeping his mouth closed and taking care not to pinch his nostrils (fig. 4).

Then blow until you see his chest rise. If you are rescue breathing through his mouth, seal your lips round his opened mouth, blocking his nostrils with your cheek (fig. 5) - or pinching them with your fingers - to prevent air leakage.

Remove your mouth and listen to him breathing out through mouth and nose - part his lips if you are breathing through his nose - while you are taking another breath (fig. 6). Inflate his lungs again as soon as he has breathed out.

Make the first 5 to 10 breaths deep and rapid. Then continue with 10 to 15 breaths a minute. When he starts trying to breathe for himself, keep your breaths in time with his efforts.

FOR INFANTS AND CHILDREN



Keep the head tilted right back, seal your mouth around the child's mouth and nose and blow gently (fig. 7). Use only puffs from your cheeks for infants. Stop blowing as soon as the chest starts to rise. Repeat breaths at least 20 times a minute. Air blown into the stomach by too forceful rescue breathing will cause bulging between ribs and navel.

This can be removed by gentle pressure (fig. 8). Turn the head and clear the throat afterwards. Keep the head lower than the chest to prevent fluid from entering the lungs.

Fig. 9 shows a practical alternative position for supporting small children during rescue breathing.

WESLEYDALE CHILDREN'S HOME WOMEN'S COMMITTEE
ANNUAL REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 31st. JULY 1972.

The General Committee has, as usual, met three times at Pitt St. during the past year - in August, November and February. The House Committee, which is in the nature of the Executive of this General Meeting, has comprised President, Secretary and Treasurer, the Matron, and Mes. Brooks, Cameron, Farmer, Gibson, Malcolm and Moir, and has met on the first Thursday of each month at the Home.

CHRISTMAS PARTY Sat. Dec. 4th.

A new timing for this was tried this year as follows:-

3-5p.m. Entertainment for children (Messrs Bowden & Parker
in charge)

3 p.m. Afternoon tea for adults - visitors welcomed
Cold drinks & ice blocks for the children

5 p.m. Sit-down tea for invited guests who were the children
and staff of Wesleydale, Board members, Foster parents and
children.

After tea, Father Christmas (Mr. Riddell) arrived in all his bearded splendour and distributed gifts from the gaily decorated tree, to the children's delight. The party was over by 7 p.m. instead of continuing until about 9 p.m. as in past years, and this new arrangement was considered much better. Sincere thanks to the Fellowships for their generous gifts of money and food. After paying for gifts for the Christmas Tree, presentations for the retiring Matron and Sub-matron, and buying some of the food, we were left with a credit of \$17.20, which was put in the General Account for future use.

A well attended GARDEN PARTY was held on March 14th. and this year we were not quite so fortunate with the weather and the stalls had to be set up inside, though the children were able to be entertained later in the afternoon, outside. The Party was officially opened by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. Maurice Copeland, who expressed warm appreciation of the valuable work done for Wesleydale by the Women's Fellowships through the Wesleydale Women's Committee. GIPTS TO THE HOME

Fellowships have been very helpful in their gifts of clothes, preserves and fruit etc. and many churches gave the proceeds of their Harvest Festivals. We are expecting a good result from our appeal for grapefruit, lemons, oranges and marmalade.

FURNISHINGS & CLOTHES

Some of the purchases this year have been:- curtains for the lounge, rubber under-sheets for beds, laundry-bags, bed-side floor rugs for boys' dormitories, boys' underclothes, girls' long white socks. Substantial donations have been made to the Board, and to the Sunshine Fund.

STAFF

Mr. & Mrs. Bowden, Master & Matron, were forced by ill-health and the need for operations, to resign from their positions at the end of 1971. This was very much regretted, and presentations of a toaster was made at the Christmas Party, and tributes to their fine work made. Mr. Bowden is now back at work as Secretary and Administrator of the Children's Work, so we have not lost him. Mrs. Bowden is gaining strength.

The Sub-matron, Miss Chadfield from Scotland, has also left us to return home, and we were sorry to lose her. She was presented with a paua shell brooch.

At the beginning of the year, Mr. & Mrs. Hollis of England, were put in charge on a temporary basis, and in April Mr. & Mrs. Huggins were appointed.

We expect the future trend of the work to be towards Family Homes, and the Board has already bought one house at Manurewa, which, it is hoped will house about 8 children with a mother & father in charge. We do not know just when this will be opened.

The care of children of broken homes is not an easy task, and the Matron & staff deserve all the practical help we can give them as well as our earnest prayers for their support and wisdom and love in solving their problems. Whatever changes the future holds for Wesleydale, our help and interest will still be needed.
