Introduction

The key original source for this booklet is the *Plan of Raithby Wesleyan Cemetery, scale 10 feet* -1 *inch*, which has had annotations made at various dates. This is part of the Methodist Church of New Zealand Archives, Parish Archives Collection. (8197 Raithby Church records). This is the only surviving contemporary original document relating to burials in the Raithby Cemetery.

Pencilled beside the title on the plan in an unknown hand, is the statement: "Laid out 1880 after church was built 1870 ground given by Mr W. Free." This statement is erroneous. The cemetery site is part of the land area on which the Raithby Church was built.

The Methodist Archives team of volunteers visited Raithby Cemetery in March 2010 to transcribe and photograph surviving headstones, and match them to the original plot plan held in the Archives.

Brief history

Raithby Methodist Church, near Loburn, was built in December 1866 on land given by Joseph Pattrick for this purpose. Settlers who gave their time to its construction included the Free, Howard¹, Philpott and Hodgson families. It was named after Raithby Hall, Lincolnshire, England, the home county of the Pattrick and Laughton families.

The memorial stone for the church was laid by Rev G S Harper on 12 December 1866, and on 30 December he preached the dedicatory sermon. Records dated December 1871 (8197 Raithby Church Sunday School minute book) show Sunday School teachers to have included Messrs Hodgson, Pattrick, and Philpott, and other families' names in the roll book included Yaxley, Free, Duncan, Fawcett, Barker and Bennett. Services were mainly led by laymen from Rangiora.

The church was noted for its extreme simplicity: a plain weatherboard building with a small entrance porch; an iron roof later concealed the original shingles. The interior had sturdy crossed roof trusses with a match-lined stained ceiling and light walls above the dado. The church was closed after a final service on 8 October 1967, and in 1978 moved to the Methodist Church's camp at Journey's End. The removal cost of \$200 was met by the Redcliffs Methodist Church Bible Class. It was moved, within the camp, to a new position in 1982, and has since been stripped of its interior timbers and sheathed in roofing iron.

J E Horrell's Ashley plan F2A shows RS 8076 (pt), ref 41/D/486, dated 12th February 1870, including the cemetery site, with the chapel indicated in the south-eastern corner of the section, immediately adjacent to the Chapel Road boundary and to RS 7917. In 1878 a village to be named Raithby was surveyed near the church and subdivided into residential sections, but the project was dropped. Raithby village, approximately 500m east of the cemetery and fronting White Rock Road, was to have been laid out on RS 9977 and RS 32858.

The cemetery plan allows for 86 plots, but fewer than 20 appear to have been used. It is not clear whether burials took place, before the cemetery was laid out in a regular pattern. The standard size of the plots is 10ft x 16ft, with the exceptions of plot A, 15 and 86 which differ in size.

There was a 7ft border encircling the cemetery and three paths, with the one in the centre of the cemetery 8ft wide. Observing the remaining trees and stumps, it seems likely there was a hedge encircling the cemetery and there may have been a gate and fence dividing the cemetery from the chapel.

The burial register has not survived. The earliest known burial, on the evidence of headstones, was in 1873, but there may have been earlier, unmarked graves. The latest marker is dated 1988.

Plots 38-41, all Philpott family, are enclosed within a single low wall, divided between graves. Their headstones are central within the long walls. Possibly the rear wall overlaps empty plots 25-27 behind the headstones, as other graves' headstones abut their respective walls where they still exist. The Philpott graves' wall is marked as constructed by Henry Silvester, a stonemason who died in 1938, and it is thought that the five graves were enclosed within their separate wall after the burial of Percy Philpott in 1934.

In 2002 the Rangiora Methodist Parish sold the grounds to a company called Trees Love People Ltd, which hoped to operate it as a private cemetery, but as that is not permitted within New Zealand's legislation, it is unknown if any burials took place. This company has been struck off the New Zealand Companies' Register.

Reynolds, Edwin George, son of John and Jane Lucy (nee Eldridge), husband of Mary Grace (nee Turner) [headstone reads Maria], family Reynolds Joseph, Harry George, Gertrude Emily, Ada Maria, Augustus Leonard, Sydney Herbert, Gilbert Edwin.

Reynolds, Augustus Leonard, son of Edwin George Reynolds, husband of Ann (nee Dutton). No family.

Todd, George, husband of Agnes (nee Gardner), family Alexander, William James, David, Charles, Frederick, Emma, Ethel.

Turner, John Frost, husband of Ann (nee King); family named in Will are Harry, Sarah Ann, and "other children" [unnamed]. Their young daughters Mary, Elizabeth, and Jane are buried in one plot.

Twentyman Hodgson is described² as "a good Methodist [who] didn't smoke, drink, gamble or use bad language" but who "when selling horses [would] provide a good pedigree when the poor horse had none." He was associated, with Robert Cresswell, in exporting the first shipment of draught horses from New Zealand to Sydney. He married a daughter of Joseph and Alice Pattrick.
